The Trail Description

Starting at the Community Garden the trail head is located at the end of the parking area to the right of the garden shed. The easy quarter mile stroll follows a cut path through a hay field. The hay in this field is harvested late in the season to protect ground nesting birds. The path ascends a modest hill and at the height of the land a kiosk with a map is located on the right. The path descends along a ruined stone wall at the edge of a hay field to a viewing platform with bench seating. The platform overlooks a beaver pond in a tranquil wetland valley. This is a quiet place with wonderful nature viewing and a rich place for bird watching. It was named for a pair of Marsh Hawks that entertained the trail crew volunteers as they worked on the property.

The Litchfield Community Garden located on the Graham Thompson Preserve is a jointly managed partnership between the Litchfield Land Trust & Litchfield Community Center. The preserve is named for Graham Thompson, a founding member, past President and early driving force for the Litchfield Land Trust.

Preserve Policies

- Stay on designated trails
- No motorized vehicles
- · No fires, swimming, hunting or trapping
- Wear orange during hunting season
- Help keep the preserve clean-no littering or dumping
